प्रथमः पाठः prathamaḥ pāṭhaḥ

हरिः ओम् (ॐ) hariḥ om = Hello.

नमोनमः namo namah = Salutations.

नमस्ते namaste = Salutations to you.

सुप्रभातम् suprabhātam = Good morning.

स्वागतम् svāgatam = Welcome.

धन्यवादः dhanyavādaḥ = Thanks (Thank you).

Pronouns

अहम् aham = I, त्वम् tvam = You, सः saḥ = He, सा sā = She, तत् tat = That.

अहम् अस्मि aham asmi = I am. त्वम् असि tvam asi = You are.

सः अस्ति saḥ asti = He is. सा अस्ति sā asti = She is. तत् अस्ति tat asti = That is.

In Samskṛtam verbal roots are called (যান্ত dhātu = verbal root, যানবঃ dhātavaḥ = verbal roots). These verbal roots are conjugated in various ways to differentiate, mood (grammtical) singular, dual or plural. Following are some examples. In these examples conjugations are used in present tense for third person, second person and first person (singular). Each conjugation is added to a noun or pronoun (subject) to form a simple sentence. In due course of time, one learns hundreds of verbal roots and their conjugations.

Verbal roots

बद् vad = to speak, पर् path = to read, लिख् likh = to write, पिब् pib = to drink, खाद् khād = to eat, (गम् gam)गच्छ् gacch = to go, (दृश् dṛś) पश्य Paśy = to see, धाव् dhāv = to run, अर्च् arc = to worship, चल् cal = to walk, गाय् gāy = to sing, गर्ज् garj = to roar.

IIIrd person

सः वदित saḥ vadati = He speaks. सा पठित sā paṭhati = She reads. तत् लिखित tat likhati = That writes. रामः पिबित rāmaḥ pibati Rāma drinks. गोविन्दः खादित govindaḥ khādati = Govinda eats. गोपालः गच्छित gopālaḥ gacchati = Gopāla goes. मुकुन्दः पश्यित mukundaḥ paśyati= Mukunda sees.

IInd person

त्वं वदिस tvam vadasi = You speak. त्वं पठिस tvam paṭhasi = You read. त्वं लिखिस tvam likhasi = You write. त्वं पिबिस tvam pibasi – You drink. त्वं खादिस tvam khādasi = You eat. त्वं गच्छिस tvam gacchasi = You go. त्वं पश्यिस tvam paśyasi = You see.

Ist person

अहं वदामि aham vadāmi = I speak. अहं पठामि aham paṭhāmi = I read. अहं लिखामि aham likhāmi = I write. अहं पिबामि aham pibāmi = I drink. अहं खादामि aham khādāmi = I eat. अहं गच्छामि aham gacchāmi = I go. अहं पश्यामि aham paśyāmi = I see.

शब्दसंग्रहः śabdasaṅgrahaḥ =Vocabulary

अश्वः aśvaḥ = horse, गजः gajaḥ = elephant, अजः ajaḥ = goat, गर्दभः gardabhaḥ = Donkey, व्याघ्रः vyāghraḥ = tiger, भक्तः bhaktaḥ = a devotee, बालिका bālikā = a girl.
